## New Manual Contingency Process for Release Labelling



## Dear Colleagues:

Beginning 2023-07-10, Canadian Blood Services will implement a **manual contingency** process to release label ONLY rare red blood cells or matched platelet components when there is an eProgesa service interruption (our information management system) and there is no release labelled inventory that meets urgent patient need. This process will not be available for other blood components.

Rare red blood cells or HLA/HPA matched apheresis platelets that meet all mandatory release testing requirements will be manually release labelled with the same label that is currently in use at Canadian Blood Services when components are subject to transformation activities during **manual contingency** such as irradiated, washed / deglycerolized.
